# 1) Thesis Master

- B. Mandatory General Courses: 3 credits (Please refer to the curriculum list.)
  - CC010 Special Lecture on Leadership (Non-credit course; Compulsory for Master's program; General scholarship students and international students are exempt from this requirement.)
  - CC020 Ethics and Safety (1AU; Must be taken in the first semester in the program; Must be taken at least once in the Master's or doctoral degree programs.)
- C. Mandatory Major Courses: 3 Credits
  - GCT501 Introduction to Culture Technology
- D. Elective Courses: 15 credits or more

Mandatory Electives (9 credits)

- Interdisciplinary Basic Courses : 1 course
- Track Courses: 2 courses from the same track

General Electives (6 credits or more)

- Only one course each in interdisciplinary basic courses and track courses is credited, except the mandatory electives.
- Maximum of 6 credits can be earned from other elective courses, graduate-level courses of other departments or other graduate schools.
- E. Research Course: 12 credits or more (including 2 seminar credits)
  - Required to earn 12 credits or more including thesis research and seminar courses
  - Three credits of the research credits can be earned by an internship program of at least 2 months in duration.

- A. Graduation Credits: at least 36 credits in total
- B. Mandatory General Courses: 3 credits (Please refer to the curriculum list.)
  - CC010 Special Lecture on Leadership (Non-credit course; Compulsory for Master's program; General scholarship students and international are exempt from this requirement.)
  - CC020 Ethics and Safety (1AU; Must be taken in the first semester in the program; Must be taken at least once in the Master's or doctoral degree programs.)
- C. Major Mandatory Courses: 3 credits
  - GCT501 Introduction to Culture Technology
- D. Elective Courses: 24 credits or more

Mandatory electives (15 credits)

- Interdisciplinary Basic Courses: 2 courses
- Track Courses: 3 courses from the same track

General Electives (9 credits or more)

- 9 credits or more must be earned from Interdisciplinary Advanced Courses and other tracks.
  Maximum of 6 credits can be earned from other elective courses, graduate-level courses of other departments or other graduate schools.
- E. Research Course: 6 credits or more (including 3 seminar credits)
  - Required to earn 6 credits or more in individual research and seminar courses.
  - 3 credits of the research credits can be earned from an internship program of at least 2 months in duration.
  - Students should organize a committee of 3 people including an advisor, a professor in the major track area; present the research outcomes to the committee during the last semester; and upon the committee's approval, submit a final report. The report requires final approval from the advisor.
- F. Coursework master can be applied at the beginning of 3rd semester with the approval of the advisor and the department chair.

A 6 month period is required before graduation after switching between a coursework master and a thesis master. (No immediate graduation allowed after switching.)

- A. Graduation Credits: at least 60 credits in total
  - Course credits earned during the master's program of the Graduate School of Culture Technology or CT interdisciplinary major can be transferred to the doctoral coursework requirements.
- B. Mandatory General Courses: 3 credits (Please refer to the curriculum list.)
  - Same as the Master's Program (not mandatory if taken in the Master's program)
  - CC020 Ethics and Safety (1AU, Must be taken in the first semester in the program; Must be taken at least once in the Master's or doctoral degree programs.)
- C. Major Mandatory Courses: 3 Credits
  - GCT501 Introduction to Culture Technology (not mandatory if taken in the Master's program)
- D. Elective Courses: 24 credits or more

Mandatory electives (15 credits)

- Interdisciplinary Basic Courses: 2 courses
- Track Courses: 3 courses from the same track

General Electives (9 credits or more)

- 9 credits or more must be earned from Interdisciplinary Advanced Courses and other tracks.
  Maximum of 6 credits can be earned from other elective courses, graduate-level courses of other departments or other graduate schools.
- E. Research Course: 30 credits or more (including 4 seminar credits)
  - Required to earn at least 30 credits in thesis research and seminar courses.
- \*\* Course credits earned during the master's coursework can be transferred to the doctoral coursework requirements (except research credits).

### ☐ Interim Measures

- A. The above completion requirements are applicable starting with 2012 freshmen.
  - (① The previous course completion requirements are applicable to students who entered the program before 2012. ② The previous course completion requirements are also applicable to students who entered the doctorate program after graduating from the master's program at the Graduate School of Culture Technology (applicable to students who graduated from the master's degree program before February 2012).
- B. The entering class of 2007 and earlier entering classes must take the seminar class once; the entering classes of 2008 or later must take the seminar class twice, 3 times, and 4 times for thesis master, coursework master, and Ph.D., respectively.
- C. Transfer students (those who finished the doctoral program for specialized research personnel at other universities) are regarded as satisfying the completion requirements of the Graduate School of Culture Technology, once all the coursework credits obtained at the other university (except research credits) are accepted. However, they are required to take the seminar class twice.
- D. Abolished courses of the Graduate School of Culture Technology that were taken before 2012 are accepted as credits obtained at the Graduate School of Culture Technology.
