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Introduction

In 2007, Goldman Sachs projected that Korea would rank second to the United States in terms of the per capita GDP by 2050. With all such efforts, the MIP Program will carry out the formidable task of creating a forum for research and education where leading professionals from government, business community, legal circle, and R&D centers gather together to search for the possible ways to tackle current and future challenges that our world faces.
