1) Course Waiver

If a requested waiver course has been completed by an applicant at undergraduate or graduate school or if an applicant has relevant work experience in the course which he/she has requested a waiver, the applicant may fill out a course waiver form and submit it to the professor offering the course. The professor shall give a test to check on the applicant's relevant knowledge on the subject and if the applicant successfully passes the exam, the professor may recommend course waiver to be approved by a chief professor. Upon approval, the applicant is obliged to substitute the waiver course with a same number of credit-hour elective course to meet the 48 credit graduation requirement.(excluding IMB590) The number of course waiver is limited to three courses only.

2) Course Waiver for International Field Trip

International field trip is a requirement for IMBA full-time students - IMB590 Global Business Network. However, this requirement can be waived for dual-degree program participants and those who are waived must register and complete a 3 credit elective course as a substitute.
