

**Major Course Requirements for
Graduate School of Culture Technology
(For Master's Program)**

Thesis Mater's Degree Program

Please check the common graduation requirements.

- **Credit Requirement for Graduation:** Required to complete a total of more than 33 credits

- **Mandatory General Courses:** 3 credits and 1AU

- **Mandatory Major Courses:** 3 Credits
 - GCT501 Introduction to Culture Technology

- **Elective Courses:** 15 credits or more
 - Required to earn 9 credits or more from GSCT elective courses
 - Maximum of 6 credits can be earned from graduate-level courses of other departments or other graduate schools.

- **Research Courses:** 12 credits or more (including 2 seminar credits)
 - Required to earn 12 credits or more including thesis research and seminar courses
 - Three credits of the research credits can be earned by an internship program of at least 2 months in duration.

Coursework Master's Degree Program

Please check the common graduation requirements.

- **Credit Requirement for Graduation:** Required to complete a total of more than 36 credits

- **Mandatory General Courses:** 3 credits and 1AU

- **Mandatory Major Courses:** 3 Credits
 - GCT501 Introduction to Culture Technology

- **Elective Courses:** 24 credits or more

- Required to earn 18 credits or more from GSCT elective courses
- Maximum of 6 credits can be earned from other elective courses, graduate-level courses of other departments or other graduate schools.

■ **Research Courses:** 6 credits or more (including 3 seminar credits)

- Required to earn 6 credits or more in individual research and seminar courses.
- 3 credits of the research credits can be earned from an internship program of at least 2 months in duration.
- Students should organize a committee of 3 people including an advisor, a professor in the major track area; present the research outcomes to the committee during the last semester; and upon the committee's approval, submit a final report. The report requires final approval from the advisor.
- Coursework master can be applied at the beginning of 3rd semester with the approval of the advisor and the department chair.

□ **Transitional Measures**

- A. The above completion requirements are applicable to all students from spring 2016.
- B. The entering class of 2007 and earlier entering classes must take the seminar class once; the entering classes of 2008 or later must take the seminar class twice, 3 times, and 4 times for thesis master, coursework master, and Ph.D., respectively.
- C. Recognition of Credits Earned at Other Universities
 - ① Credits that have already been earned at other universities may be accepted up to 24 credits (except research credits) upon gaining approvals from the advisor, professor in charge of the course, and the department head.
 - ② Transfer students (those who finished the doctoral program for specialized research personnel at other universities) are regarded as satisfying the completion requirements of the Graduate School of Culture Technology, once all the coursework credits obtained at the other university (except research credits) are accepted. However, they are required to take the seminar class twice.
- D. Abolished courses of the Graduate School of Culture Technology that were taken before 2011 are accepted as credits obtained at the Graduate School of Culture Technology.

(For Doctoral Program)**

Please check the common graduation requirements.

Credit Requirement for Graduation: Required to complete a total of more than 60 credits

- Course credits earned during the master's program of the Graduate School of Culture Technology or CT interdisciplinary major can be transferred to the doctoral coursework requirements.

Mandatory General Courses: 3 credits and 1AU

Mandatory Major Courses: 3 Credits

- GCT501 Introduction to Culture Technology

Elective Courses: 24 credits or more

- Required to earn 18 credits or more from GSCT elective courses
- Maximum of 6 credits can be earned from other elective courses, graduate-level courses of other departments or other graduate schools.

Research Courses: 30 credits or more(including 4 seminar credits)

- Required to earn at least 30 credits in thesis research and seminar courses.
