

1 ● Educational Purpose

The new curriculum is offered to train students in the IP Minor Program to learn various IP types as a whole, be equipped with both theoretical knowledge and ability for practical applications, and ultimately grow to be world leaders driving the forces in the global economy with their knowledge on different IP norms of various jurisdictions.

The students have an option to choose between the IP Management Track and the IP Prosecution Track, depending on their future professional fields. Detailed goals and objectives of the IP Minor Program are as following:

- Offering integrated knowledge on IP rights
 - Because today’s companies have to protect and manage technologies considering the various IP rights as a whole, the four required major courses cover patents, copyrights, trademarks, and trade secrets. Students are expected to acquire knowledge to compare and analyze the pros and cons of each IP right.
- Enabling students to acquire practical knowledge as well as theoretical basis of IP laws.
- Offering two tracks – “IP Prosecution track” for future IP professionals; “IP Management track” for scientists, engineers, and business managers
- Offering comparative IP law knowledge on differences of jurisdictions, including the United States and Korea

Students pursuing IP Minor Program should take one required major course and additional four elective major courses according to their respective choice of the track. The students who desire to be trained as IP professionals may choose the Prosecution Track, while those who desire training as scientists, engineers, or managers may choose the IP Management Track.
